We have been made aware of the 'Blue Whale Challenge' that is doing the rounds on social media. A 50 day challenge where an administrator invites a player (child) to engage in a daily self harm task, which get worse as the days go on.

Blue Whale Challenge has existed on social media for a long while now the challenge is for young people to complete 50 tasks over 50 days, starting with things such as wake up in the night or watch a scary movie, as the days go on the tasks get more and more sinister with the final task on day 50 being to commit suicide which has resulted globally in many deaths. There is usually an individual involved telling people what tasks to complete each day.
